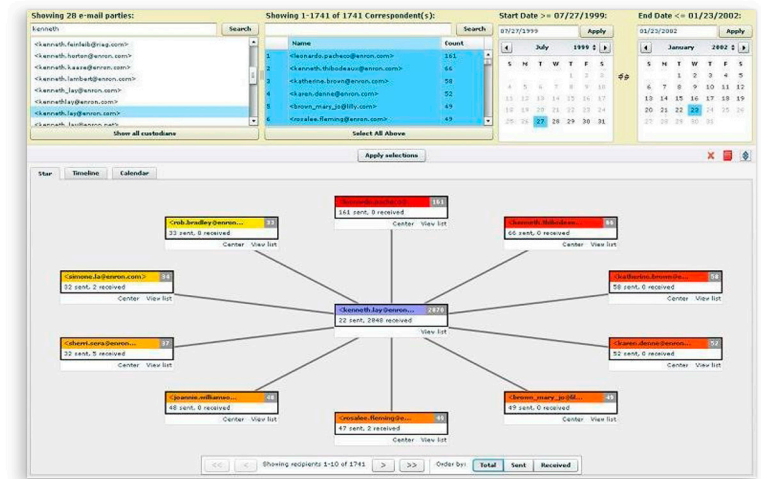


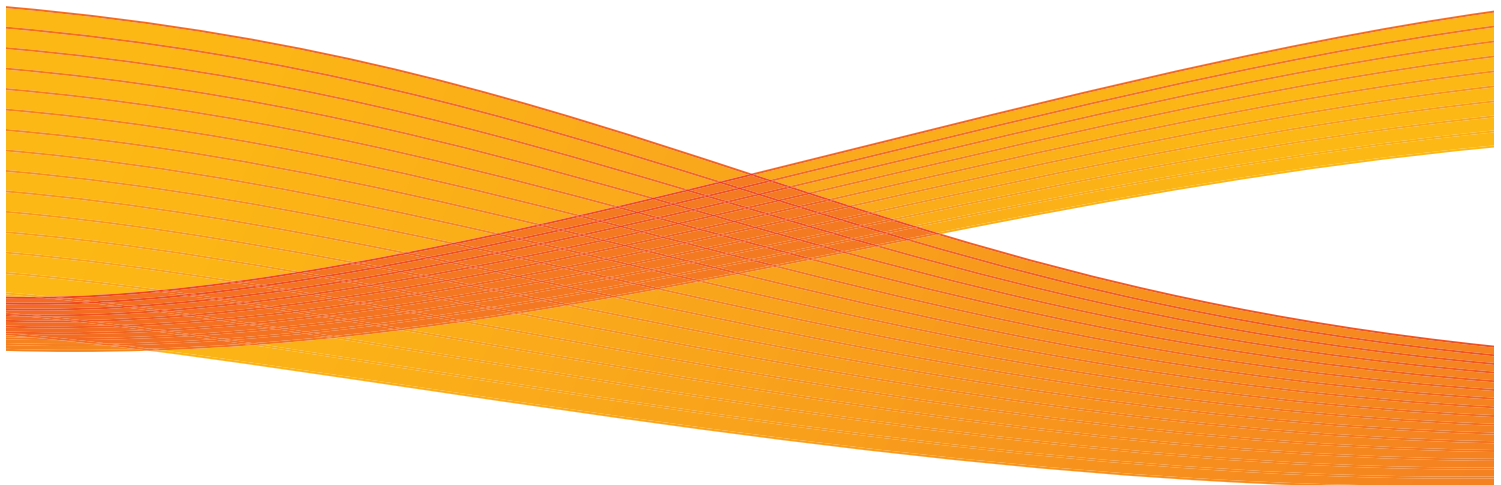

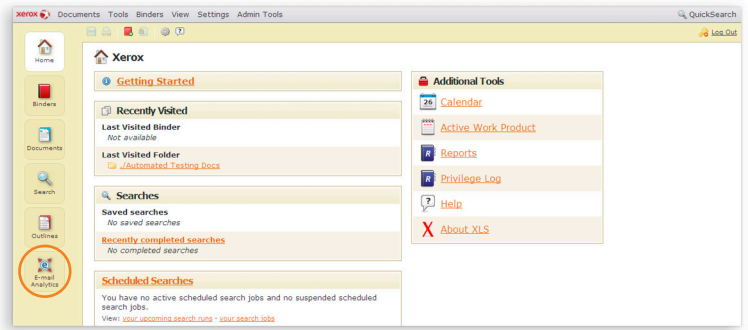

- Use star view to visualize communication patterns and volumes—the party you wish to research is displayed in the center with radial spokes pointing to the people with whom the party communicated

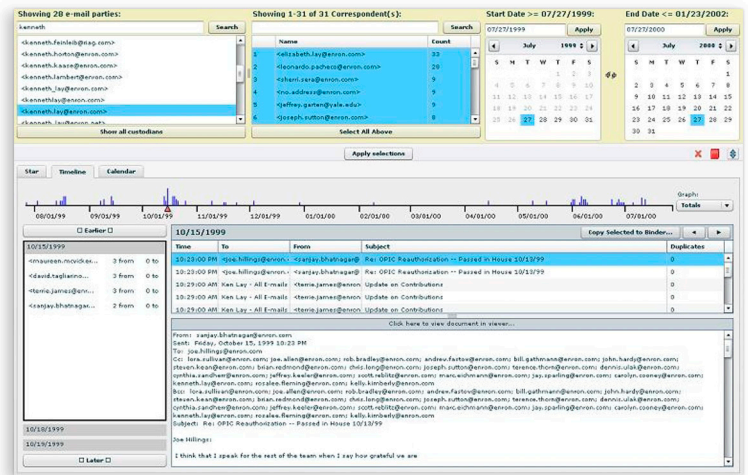

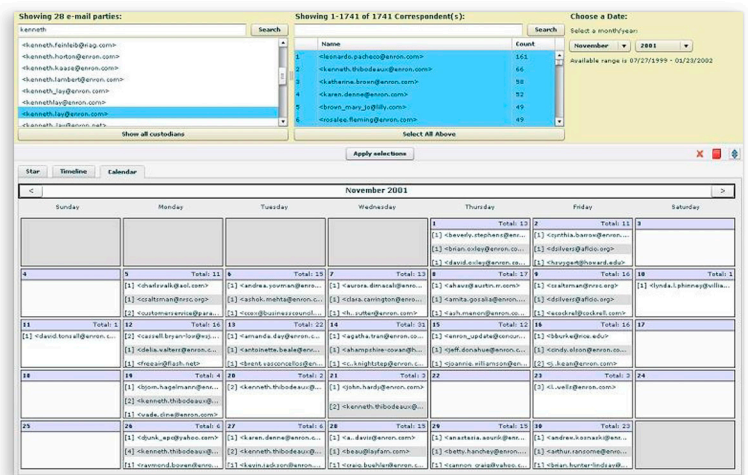
